

#### What is SERVGA?

SERVGA integrates government-sponsored local, regional and statewide volunteer programs to assist emergency response and public safety organizations during a disaster. It is part of a national initiative to coordinate and mobilize volunteers to respond to all types of emergencies.

SERVGA is a statewide secure database of precredentialed healthcare professionals and other volunteers who want to help in case of a public health emergency.

# Who should register in SERVGA?

Volunteers of all skill levels and backgrounds are needed during an emergency response. You can assist in a wide variety of tasks that include data entry, serving meals to shelter residents, or providing medical care. Whether you are a licensed and certified healthcare provider, an administrative specialist, a retired professional or just someone who wants to help the community in a disaster, SERVGA needs you.

## **What Other Programs Help SERVGA?**

The following organizations composed of SERVGA include the Medical Reserve Corps (MRC), Georgia Nurse Alert System and Community Emergency Response Teams (CERT).

### What is Required to Register in SERVGA?

Registering at www.servga.gov is quick and can be done within minutes. Name, address, contact information and occupation type completes the initial registration process. In order to be eligible for potential assignments (local/instate/out-of-state), responders are encouraged to complete a Profile Summary, which includes:

- Skills & Certifications
- Training
- Medical History
- Emergency Contact
- Deployment Preferences (specify local/in-state/out-of state assignments)
